# Parking: What's Right, What's Wrong



**You can park an auto, small truck (under 10,000 lbs GVW), RV, or trailer:**

- On your own property (the number allowed depends on the residential zone)
- On private property such as a vacant lot where you have the owner's permission
- On a public street, while obeying public laws.
- On a residential street (maximum of one small commercial truck per residence)
- In a parking lot owned by a commercial business (like a store), while obeying rules set by the owner.

**You may not park :**

- Large trucks (10,000+ lbs GVW) in certain residential zones.
- Trailer or oversized vehicles on residential streets, or on small residential lots.

## What Could Happen

Parking on the street in violation of public laws can result in fines, towing, or both.

Parking on private property without permission or in commercial lots in violation of the owner's rules can result in warnings or towing.

## What Do I Do When...

- **Somebody is parked in front of my driveway.**

Try to locate the person and ask them to move — it's faster than calling to have them towed. If you can't find the driver, call \_\_\_\_\_ to ask for the vehicle to be towed.

- **Someone is parked in front of my mailbox and it's hard to reach the mail.**

This is a nuisance but is not illegal. Try to find the driver and explain the problem, or put a polite note up on your mailbox asking people to leave you some room.

- **There are multiple trucks regularly parked on our street. I think someone is running a business from their house.**

Copy down license numbers and a brief description of the trucks. Call \_\_\_\_\_ and give the information. An officer will come out to check.

- **There is an abandoned vehicle on my street.**

Call \_\_\_\_\_ with the vehicle location and description. Someone will post a warning on the vehicle and it will be towed if it is not moved.

- **Someone reported my vehicle as abandoned but I'm just waiting for money to fix it.**

The vehicle cannot stay more than 72 hrs in one place. It is best to move it on to your own prop-

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
